Today's Music

The words to "America the Beautiful" were written by Katherine Lee Bates (1859-1929) in 1893. An English professor and writer (and the daughter of a minister), Bates travelled by train from Massachusetts through Chicago (for the World's Fair) to Colorado Springs, CO, where she climbed Pike's Peak. The words reportedly started to come to her on the top of the mountain, and she later revised the words twice. Over the years people have speculated about the various references in the song—"alabaster cities" (Chicago), "amber waves of grain" (Kansas), etc. The words were published in 1895, and became popular. The tune by Samuel Ward (MATERNA) was originally for another song, but was joined to the words in 1910, long after Ward had passed on. Many people prefer this to the Star-Spangled Banner because it is frankly much easier to sing!
