## Today's Music

Today's anthem is an example of creative persons building on the foundations of the past while working to improve the present. "When I Survey The Wondrous Cross" is considered to be one of the great hymns of the church. Its words were written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), the son of a deacon in a Congregational church, which was a "radical" church in England at that time. Watts was determined to improve the quality of congregational singing which he knew to be sub-standard. "The singing of God's praise is the part of worship most closely related to heaven; but its performance among us is the worst on earth," he wrote.

The now-familiar music to this hymn was not written until 1824 by American Lowell Mason (1792-1872). Mason was one of the most influential musicians in the United States in the 19th Century because he fought to include music in the public school curriculum, and also

was heavily involved in church music. His tune is based on Gregorian chant, the non-metrical, unison singing of the Medieval Christian church (which was itself based on Jewish roots).

Arranger Gilbert Martin (b.1941) was a student at Westminster Choir College, (one of the great institutions of the choral art in America), and this arrangement is dedicated to its graduating class of 1968. Martin's arrangement for organ and choir, which subtly builds from a very soft men's entrance to a triumphant finish, is now considered the best arrangement of this hymn, which contains within its "DNA" over 1000 years of Christian praise.
